WELCOME

2024–25 has been a year of consolidation, growth, and achievement for Hands Across Canberra as we strengthen our engagement across the community.

The Canberra Day Appeal exceeded all expectations, raising more than \$840,000 for participating charities. In addition, we ran the Gears 4 Giving small grant rounds, the annual Sue Salthouse leadership grants and a Christmas gift appeal.

More than 350 charities used our platform to raise funds, increasing donations by 150%. We delivered capacity building workshops in governance, efficiency, and innovation to the charity sector, with more to come.

Working with our Canberra Foundations Collaborative partners the Snow Foundation, John James Foundation and additional funders Aspen Medical and Davencare, we made almost \$2 million worth of grants to projects across the community, meeting urgent need.

Our first major corporate partnership offering, the HAC Heroes, is flourishing alongside our named fund donors, who are the core of the organisation's financial sustainability.

This report provides a brief glimpse into all the ways your generous donations are strengthening our community. Thank you to everyone who gives of their gifts, time, and talents to make this possible.

Together, we are building a better and fairer Canberra for us all.

- Reached \$6.17 million in assets across CMCF and HAC

CHIEF MINISTER'S CHARITABLE FUND



The Chief Minister's Charitable Fund (CMCF) was established by the ACT Government in 2018 as a long-term resource designed to meet the broad and evolving needs of our community.

A \$5 million Government investment seeded the fund and is topped up each year, including a further \$416,000 in 2024–25. The fund is administered by Hands Across Canberra for the benefit of all Canberrans.

Since its inception, the CMCF has:

- supported 251 + projects
- distributed over \$3.1 million
- leveraged more than \$8.1 million in additional funds for the community

Responding to emerging needs throughout the Canberra region, in 2024–25 the Chief Minister's Charitable Fund:

- joined HAC supporters and 102 charities for the Canberra Day Appeal, raising \$840,000 for the community sector
- administered a collective grant round valued at over \$2 million and funded 20 projects through CMCF, of which seven are multiyear grants
- distributed \$600,000 to the community sector to address mental health, employment, housing and belonging challenges
